# Appointment of six new members to the UNESCO Global Geoparks Council

According to the Statutes of the International Geoscience and Geoparks Programme (IGGP) and Operational Guidelines for UNESCO Global Geoparks approved by the 38th General Conference, the UNESCO Global Geoparks Council are composed of 12 ordinary members appointed by the Director-General of UNESCO on recommendation of the Global Geoparks Network (GGN) and of Member States. Every two years, half of the membership of the Council shall be renewed.

From 7 February 2020 to 15 April 2020, the Secretariat of the UNESCO Global Geoparks opened a call to renew six UNESCO Global Geoparks Council members by informing UNESCO Member States and Observers, as well as the GGN.

This call and all relevant documents were also available on the UNESCO website and on the website of the GGN. Twenty-four candidates nominated by Member States and the Global Geoparks Network responded to the call.

After reviewing all 13 eligible candidates, keeping in mind the priority gender in UNESCO and ensuring a good geographical distribution of the Council members, while making sure we still have highly qualified members, below listed experts were nominated by UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay for the new UNESCO Global Geoparks Council and they will start their activities in September 2020.


# The Global Geoparks Network celebrates the

The Global Geoparks Network encouraged all the UNESCO Global Geoparks to participate in the World Cleanup Day campaign and promoted the events through our social media.


Many Geoparks all over the world organized activities in the frame of the campaign.

Araripe UNESCO Global Geopark (Brazil) joined the movement by organising litter picking sessions across the Geopark. Here are some activities that they are sharing with us:








# **Batur UNESCO Global Geopark (Indonesia)**

#### Djerdap UNESCO Global Geopark (Serbia)

Djerdap UNESCO Global Geopark organized a cleaning action and shared the information on the profiles of Djerdap UNESCO Global Geopark and Djerdap National Park on social networks, as well as the news on the website, with messages that it is important to be aware of the Geopark actions and think about environmental protection.

In previous years, Djerdap found an example of good practice. The Public enterprise Djerdap National Park", the management body of the Djerdap National Park and now the management body of the Djerdap UNESCO Global Geopark, annually allocates a certain amount from own funds, which it forwards to the utility companies on the territory of each municipality.

It is an incentive to solve the problem of garbage and there is noticeably less garbage in nature, especially along the main road, at rest areas. Also, this cooperation implies that certain services of utility companies are at the service of the local population for the collecting and disposing the non-municipal waste. As management body, they often work on educating both the local population and the visitors. Boards with instructions and explanations are placed on the entire territory.

One of their basic missions is to convey the message of how important is to preserve nature and influence people's habits and behavior to change for the better. Together for our planet.




**Huanggang Dabieshan UNESCO Global Geopark (China)**


## Karavanke-Karawanken UNESCO Global Geopark (Austria & Slovenia)
