More digital activities will be announced soon ...







DIGITAL COURSE ON UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS

UNESCO Global Geoparks and Sustainability

7 – 20 June 2021



The Digital Course on UNESCO Global Geoparks 2021 on "UNESCO Global Geoparks and Sustainability" was organised with great success from 7th to 20th June, 2021. It was the second course that was organised digitally due to COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

The Course was co-organised by UNESCO and the Global Geoparks Network with the collaboration of 40 Geopark experts all around the world.

It was hosted and delivered by the University of the Aegean, the UNESCO Chair on Geoparks and Sustainable Development of insular and coastal areas and the Natural History Museum of the Lesvos Petrified Forest (Lesvos Island UNESCO Global Geopark – Greece).

It was attended by 250 participants and lecturers from 56 countries all around the globe, including Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bangladesh, Belgium, Brazil, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Ecuador, Egypt, Eswatini, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Pakistan, Philippines, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, Thailand, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom, USA, Vietnam and Zambia. The Course on Geoparks 2021 focused on UNESCO Global Geoparks and their contribution to the Sustainable Development.

The course provided the opportunity to discover how UNESCO Global Geoparks can make a real impact in local communities and in the society as a whole during COVID-19 pandemic but also provided conceptual issues on UNESCO Global Geoparks.

During the Course the following main topics were discussed:

- UNESCO Global Geoparks & Global Geoparks Network (GGN)
- Regional Geoparks Networks
- UNESCO Global Geoparks, 'Memory of the Earth' territories
- UNESCO Global Geoparks, territories of culture and nature
- UNESCO Global Geoparks: Sustainability and Territorial Management
- UNESCO Global Geoparks: Sustainable tourism destinations
- Local and Indigenous communities in UNESCO Global Geoparks
- Natural hazard and climate change
- Geoparks and Education activities and innovations
- How to build a successful geopark (virtual exercise)
- Evaluation and Revalidation procedures
- UNESCO Global Geoparks The 'World After' (VISION OF FUTURE)

During the Digital Course, the participants attended lectures by 40 internationally renowned scientists and experts from UNESCO and UNESCO Global Geoparks, who presented good practices on UNESCO Global Geoparks, the procedures of becoming and operating successful Geoparks, the evaluation and revalidation procedure as well as the guide lines of the UNESCO Global Geoparks.

Participants had also the opportunity to discover good practices examples from Lesvos Island UNESCO Global Geopark through the following VIRTUAL TOURS:


• "UNESCO Global Geoparks: Climate Change Adaptation case studies – The GREEN Geopark Museum" by Dr. Ilias Valiakos

During the Course the participants had also the opportunity to present their projects connected with UNESCO Global Geoparks and their research work.

97.5% of the participants evaluated the Course as excellent and extremely excellent. Lectures and the teaching level were of the most important components of the course and 95.8% of the participants agreed that the Course met the reasons why they participated in it.

The main purpose of the UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM is to offer to young people an opportunity to get engaged more concretely in the preparation of the philosophy mandate and activities of the UNESCO Global Geoparks and foster their commitment to the realization of the future they want and being actors of change in their territories. They will also elaborate their proposal for actions contributing to the UNESCO Global Geoparks strategic framework for action 2021-2025.

The 1st UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM will be held in Jeju Island during the 9th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks in 15th of December 2021.

All 44 Youth Representative will get a financial support for their participation in the 1st UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM. The financial support will cover the travel and accommodation expenses for the one representative of each country.

All youth representatives will be also invited to participate in preparatory digital meetings of the UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARKS YOUTH FORUM, with the participation of UNESCO, the GGN Executive Board.
